- 1. Material evidence, not merely hearsay or professional opinion that the ruling in *Godden V. Hales* ((1686), 2 Shower, 475), has been set aside.
- 2. Material evidence, not merely hearsay of professional opinion, that the ruling in *Rex v Walcott* (1683), has been set aside.
- 3. Material evidence, not merely hearsay of professional opinion, that the Coronation Oath, as prescribed by the *Coronation Oath Act 1688*, does not place a firm and unremitting constraint upon the Monarch of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, to defend the Rights, Liberties, and protestant Religion of the Subject.
