Case History

- Under the uncodified Constitution of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, it is the reigning Monarch who holds the Sovereignty of the Subject, in trust for future generations.
- 2. Under the uncodified Constitution of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, all members of both Houses of Parliament, are required by law to make an oath of allegiance to the Sovereign, establishing their loyalty, and subservience to the Sovereign.
- 3. On the Twenty-third Day of June 2016, a referendum was held throughout the UK regarding continued membership of the European Union, with the majority of those voting, choosing to leave, giving Parliament a clear mandate to facilitate the withdrawal of the UK from the EU.
- 4. On the Twelfth Day of December 2019 a General Election is held in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, with the Conservative party winning a landslide Eighty seat majority.

- On the Thirteenth Day of December 2019, Alexander Boris Pfeffel Johnson accepted the invitation to form a Government by Elizabeth II.
- **6.** It is recorded in the *Commons Hansard (Volume 669),* that on the Seventeenth Day of December 2019, the process of swearing in the returned Members of Parliament began, following the General Election.
- **7.** It is recorded in the *Commons Hansard (Volume 669),* that on the Twentieth Day of December 2019, the process of swearing in the returned Members of Parliament continued with a further five named members sworn.
- 8. It is recorded in the *Commons Hansard (Volume 669)*, that on the Twentieth Day of December 2019, the House proceeded to a Division, subsequent to the Second reading of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill (Programme), with Three Hundred and Fifty-eight (358) voting Aye, and Two Hundred and Thirty-four (234) voting Noe.
- **9.** It is recorded in the *Commons Hansard (Volume 669),* that on the Ninth Day of January 2020, the House proceeded to a Division,

subsequent to the Third reading of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill (Programme), with Three Hundred and Thirty (330) voting Aye, and Two Hundred and Thirty-one (231) voting Noe.

- 10. It is recorded in the *Lords Hansard (Volume 801),* that on the Ninth Day of January 2020, the first reading of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill occurred.
- 11. It is recorded in the Lords Hansard (Volume 801), that on the Thirteenth Day of January 2020, the second reading of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill occurred.
- 12. It is recorded in the Lords Hansard (Volume 801), that on the Twenty-first Day of January 2020, the third reading of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill occurred.
- 13. It is recorded in the *Lords Hansard (Volume 801),* that on the Twenty-first Day of January 2020, the House of Lords proceeded to a Division, subsequent to the Third reading of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill, with Three Hundred (300) voting Content, and Two Hundred and Twenty (220) voting Not Content.

- 14. It is recorded in the Lords Hansard (Volume 801), that on the Twenty-first Day of January 2020, at 6:09pm the following Act was given Royal Assent: European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act.
- **15.** On the Thirty-first Day of January 2020, the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020* commenced.
- **16.** S.38 of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020, states 'It is recognised that the Parliament of the United Kingdom is sovereign'.
- 17. On the Thirty-first Day of January 2020, the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020 commenced, and the criminal conspiracy within the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, to deprive the reigning Monarch of the title of Sovereign, saw its heinous fruition.

Conclusion

The definition of Sovereign given within Black's law dictionary; A person, body, or state in which independent and supreme authority is vested; a chief ruler with supreme power, a king or other ruler in a monarchy.

Prior to the Glorious Revolution of 1688/89 it was established in *Godden V. Hales ((1686), 2 Shower, 475),* that the Monarch is Sovereign, when the Court of Kings Bench, Lord Chief Justice Herbert presiding, summarised its findings by saying, 'that this is not a trust invested in, or granted to, the king by the people, but the ancient remains of the sovereign power and prerogative of the kings of England, which never yet was taken from them, nor can be.'

Subsequent to the Glorious Revolution, the *Coronation Oath Act* [1688] was used to constrain the Sovereign, and the powers of the royal prerogative, while the *Bill of Rights* [1688], that is unrepealed to this day, identifies the Monarch(s) as the Sovereign in clear and unambiguous terms by including the words, 'and of right ought to be by the laws of this realm our sovereign liege lord and lady, King and Queen of England, France and Ireland'.

.....

It is clearly evident, and evidenced by Queen Ann withholding royal assent to the Scottish Militia Bill, on the Eleventh Day of March 1708, the Monarch of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, is a distinct, and separate entity to the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

It is clearly evident, and evidenced under the uncodified Constitution of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, that through their oaths of allegiance, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons alike, are the Servants of the Monarch.

The oath of allegiance can be traced back to at least the time of *Magna Carta Libertatium* sealed at Runnymede on the Fifteenth Day of June 1215, and are therefore a requirement under English law, that all crown servants, and members of the judiciary make and uphold the oath of allegiance, as recorded to this day within various Acts of Parliament, not limited to, but including the *Bill of Rights [1688]*.

The swearing of the oath of allegiance establishes a promise of loyalty to the Sovereign, the offence of treason in English law is a breach of allegiance, that can be committed only by him who owes allegiance, perpetual or

temporary. The offence of high treason at common law, is the crime of disloyalty to the Sovereign.

High treason is considered to be the most serious of offences (more than murder, or other heinous felonies), as the crime threatens the peace and security of the nation, and has historically been met with extraordinary punishment, that has included seeing perpetrators hung, drawn, and quartered.

The misprision of treason is an offence under English law, and is committed where a person knows that a treason is being planned or committed, and does not report it as soon as he can to a justice of the peace or other authority.

Rex v Walcott (1683) is a leading case on the distinction between treason, and the misprision of treason, where Lord Chief Justice Pemberton stated, 'For a man to hear of treason or occasionally and conceal it is but misprision, but if a man will be at consult where treason is hatched and will then conceal it he is guilty of treason therein.'

.....

Treason is such a serious matter that while the privilege of the peerage, and parliamentary privilege precludes the arrest of peers, and members of parliament for certain crimes, under English law, treason and other felonies are outside the scope of such prohibition.

It is clearly evidenced in section 38, of the purported *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020,* that the Lords Spiritual, and Temporal, and Members of the Commons, have declared the Parliament of the United Kingdom, Sovereign.

It is clearly evident and evidenced, that under both English law, and Statutory legislation the Lords Spiritual, and Temporal, and Members of the Commons, involved in declaring the Parliament of the United Kingdom, Sovereign, have each made a contractually binding oath of allegiance, to the Monarch.

It is clearly evident and evidenced, by declaring the Parliament of the United Kingdom Sovereign, the Lords Spiritual, and Temporal, and Members of the Commons, involved have breached their individual oaths of loyalty, and therefore must answer the serious, and evidenced allegations of high treason.

I, Mark.wyschna a living man, currently domiciled XXXXXXXXX, St Albans, XXXXXXX, do solemnly and sincerely swear and declare with good faith and without prejudice.

I was born on the 21st March 1974 and am 48 years of age. I am of sound mind and reason and do sincerely and honestly swear the present instrument to be my own words, written by me, given freely, and without duress and expressing accurately to the best of my knowledge.

This bundle, and Affidavit of Truth consists of 147 page's each endorsed by me.

- 1. I say that, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, has an uncodified Constitution, that includes *Magna Carta 1215*, the *Bill of Rights [1688]*, and the Scottish *Claim of Right Act 1689*.
- 2. I say that, under English law it is the reigning Monarch who is the Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
- **3. I say that,** it is recognised in the following non exhaustive list of Statutory legislation, that it is the reigning Monarch who is the

Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, *Bill of Rights [1688,]* **1688 CHAPTER 2 1 Will and Mar Sess 2**, *Act of Settlement (1700)*, **1700 CHAPTER 2 12 and 13 Will 3**, *Union with Scotland Act 1706*, **1706 CHAPTER 11 6 Ann**, *Union with England Act 1707*, **1707 c.7**, *Succession to the Crown Act 1707*, **1707 CHAPTER 41 6 Ann**, *Promissory Oaths Act 1868*, **1868 CHAPTER 72 31 and 32 Vict**, *Accession Declaration Act 1910*, **1910 CHAPTER 29 10 Edw 7 and 1 Geo 5** *Sovereign Grant Act 2011*, **2011 CHAPTER 15**.

- 4. I say that, it is a requirement of Law, under the uncodified Constitution of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, that subsequent to a General Election, all members of both Houses of Parliament, are compelled to make a fresh oath of allegiance to the Sovereign, before they may take their seat or, participate in any Parliamentary business.
- 5. I say that, under English law, since the ruling of the English Parliament of Edward III in 1366, that held the *Treaty of Verona 1213 void ab initio*, the Monarch may not surrender the Sovereignty of the nation, without the express, and fully informed consent of the Nation.

- **6. I say that,** under English law, as evidenced within *Magna Carta 1215*, the Monarch is accountable under law.
- 7. I say that, under English law Bessie Wallis Simpson, the love interest of Edward VIII, did not meet the legal requirement of a Queen Consort, thereby Edward VIII was forced to choose between love, and his duty, leading to his abdication, clearly demonstrating even the Sovereign is bound by the law.
- 8. I say that, it is a requirement under the Statutory legislation the *Parliamentary Oaths Act 1866*, **1866 CHAPTER 19 29 and 30 Vict**, that at the beginning of each and every Parliament, the oath of allegiance be solemnly sworn, by each member before they take their seat, and before they participate in any debate.
- 9. I say that, the Right for a Member of Parliament to affirm was provided under the *Oaths Act 1888*, 1888 CHAPTER 46 51 and 52 Vict.

- 10. I say that, the current form for the oath of allegiance, or the affirmation of allegiance, each Member of Parliament must either swear, or affirm respectively, is recorded in the *Oaths Act 1978*, 1978 CHAPTER 19.
- **11. I say that,** the form of the oath made by each returned Member of Parliament, subsequent to the General Election that occurred on the Twelfth Day of December 2019, who participated in any of the Divisions which occurred in the House of Commons on the Twentieth Day of December 2019, the Ninth Day of January 2020, or in the House of Lords on the Twenty-first Day of January 2020, that led to Parliament declaring itself Sovereign, in the *E.U. (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020*, was sworn as;

'I (members name) swear by Almighty God that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, her heirs and successors, according to law. So help me God.'

12. I say that, the form of the affirmation, made by each returned Member of Parliament who did not make the oath of allegiance, subsequent to the General Election that occurred on the Twelfth Day

of December 2019, who participated in any of the Divisions which occurred in the House of Commons on the Twentieth Day of December 2019, the Ninth Day of January 2020, or in the House of Lords on the Twenty-first Day of January 2020, that led to Parliament declaring itself Sovereign, in the *E.U. (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020,* was affirmed as;

'I (members name) do solemnly, sincerely, and truly declare and affirm, that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, her heirs and successors, according to law.'

- **13. I say that,** for all intents and purposes under English law, the swearing, or affirming serve the same purpose of establishing the loyalty of the man, or woman, to the reigning Sovereign.
- 14. I say that, under English law the swearing of oaths when required to do so, as evidenced by the removal of the Duke of York in 1673, from the position of Lord High Admiral, through refusing to comply with the *Test Act 1673*, 25 Car. II c.2. is a non-negotiable obligation, upon all holders of public office.

- 15. I say that, on the Twelfth Day of August 1997, the newly elected Sinn Fein politician Martin McGuiness applied to the High Court of Justice of Northern Ireland for leave to apply for judicial review, in relation to the requirement of *Parliamentary Oaths Act 1866*, in so far as it required him to swear or affirm his allegiance to the British monarchy, was incompatible with his constitutional rights as an MP. Mr Justice Kerr refused the application on the Third Day of October 1997, demonstrating the clear requirement to comply with the *Parliamentary Oaths Act 1866*, without exception.
- **16. I say that,** under English law the offence of treason is a breach of allegiance, that can be committed only by him who owes allegiance, perpetual or temporary.
- 17. I say that, subsequent to the General Election that was held on the Twelfth Day of December 2019, a new Parliament was opened on the Nineteenth Day of December 2019.
- 18. I say that, in accord with Statutory legislation the *Bill of Rights*[1688], Members of both Houses of Parliament are entitled to debate

any matter they so wish, even deposing the Monarchy and forming a republic.

- **19. I say that,** in accord with Statutory legislation the *Bill of Rights [1688]* with specific reference to Enactment III, the *Parliamentary Oaths Act 1866,* the *Oaths Act 1978,* and the oath, or affirmation of Allegiance each and every serving Member of Parliament is under, would make dividing on any issue such as deposing the Monarchy and forming a republic, a breach of their allegiance and an offence of treason in English law.
- **20. I say that,** it is recorded on the public record, that on the Thirty-first Day of January 2020, the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020* commenced.
- **21. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/01 is a copy of S.38 *European Union* (*Withdrawal Agreement*) *Act 2020,* seized from the legislation.gov.uk website as evidence.

- **22. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/01 clearly evidences the Parliament of the United Kingdom, have declared themselves Sovereign.
- **23. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/01 clearly evidences that Divisions have occurred involving, purported Members of Parliament who have breached their respective oath, or affirmation of allegiance to the Sovereign at that time, our late and beloved Elizabeth II, which under English law, is an act of treason.
- 24. I say that, the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020, suggests the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, does not require the assent of the Monarch to legislate, arising from the definition of Sovereign, in Black's law, 2nd edition.
- 25. I say that, An Act for Safety and Preservation of His Majesties Person and Government against Treasonable and Seditious practices and attempts, that is also known as the Sedition Act 1661, and recorded as
 13 Car 2 St 1 c1, was purportedly repealed in its entirety from

statutory legislation as an obsolete crime, by the Criminal Law Act 1967, **1967 CHAPTER 58**.

- 26. I say that, the Sedition Act 1661, was drawn from the laws of God and given the stare decisis in Godden V. Hales ((1686), 2 Shower, 475), the offences identified within the Sedition Act 1661, remain to this day, under English common law.
- 27. I say that, S.III Sedition Act 1661, includes the words, 'that both Houses of Parliament or either House of Parliament have or hath a Legislative Power without the King or any other words to the same effect That then every such person & persons soe (<u>(fn. 2)</u>) aforesaid offending shall incurr the danger and penalty of a Premunire mentioned in a Statute made in the sixteenth yeare of the Reigne of King Richard the Second', and that S.38 European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020, does just such thing.

28. I say that, the *Treason Felony Act 1848*, 1848 CHAPTER 12 11 and 12 Vict, stand as statutory legislation, during the period between the Twelve Day of December 2019, and the Thirty-first Day of January 2020, when the treason occurred.

- **29. I say that,** S.III *Treason Felony Act 1848*, clearly includes the words 'If any person whatsoever shall, within the United Kingdom or without, compass, imagine, invent, devise, or intend to deprive or depose our Most Gracious Lady the Queen, from the style, honour, or royal name of the imperial crown of the United Kingdom,'.
- **30. I say that,** as recently as the *Sovereign Grant Act 2011,* which received Royal assent on the Eighteenth Day of October 2011, and commenced on the First Day of April 2012, the reigning Monarch is the Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
- **31. I say that,** S.38 *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020,* has deprived the style, and the honour, of the title of Sovereign, thereby contravening S.III *Treason Felony Act 1848,* by each and every Member of Parliament, who participated in a Division within either of the Houses of Parliament, on such a treasonous, and seditious conspiracy against the Sovereign, and the Sovereigns subjects.

- **32. I say that,** it is recorded in the *Commons Hansard* for the Twentieth Day of December 2019 (*Volume 669*), a Division occurred in relation to the Second reading of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill.*
- **33. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/02 is a copy of the Division record that occurred in the House of Commons, on the Twentieth Day of December 2019 subsequent, and in relation to the Second reading of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill,* seized from the votes.parliament.uk website.
- **34. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/02 clearly evidences the Division Date and Time recorded as the Twentieth Day of December 2019, at 14:14, and the subject matter of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill.*
- **35. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/2 clearly evidences the participation of Five Hundred and Ninety-six (including tellers), named and therefore identifiable Members of Parliament, of the United Kingdom

of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, in a Division on what would become, the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020.*

- **36. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/02 clearly evidences, Five Hundred and Ninety-six, named and therefore identifiable Members of Parliament, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland breaching their oath, or affirmation of allegiance.
- **37. I say that,** it is recorded in the *Commons Hansard* for the Ninth Day of January 2020 (*Volume 669*), a Division occurred in relation to the Third reading of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill.*
- **38. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/03 is a copy of the Division record that occurred in the House of Commons, on the Ninth Day of January 2020 subsequent, and in relation to the Third reading of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill*, seized from the votes.parliament.uk website.

- **39. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/03 clearly evidences the Division Date and Time recorded as the Ninth Day of January 2020, at 17:10, and the subject matter of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill.*

- **42. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/04 is a compiled list of each, and every purported Member of the House of Commons, who participated in either, or both Divisions in the House of Commons (including tellers), that occurred on the Twentieth Day of December 2019, at

14:14, and the Ninth Day of January 2020, at 17:10, in regard to the Second, and the Third reading respectively, of what became the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020.*

- **43. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/04 clearly evidences, Six Hundred and Twenty-four, named and therefore identifiable Members of Parliament, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland breaching their oath, or affirmation of allegiance.
- **44. I say that,** it is recorded in the *Lords Hansard* for the Twenty-first Day of January 2020 (*Volume 801*), a Division occurred in relation to the Third reading of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill.*
- **45. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/05 is a copy of the Division record that occurred in the House of Lords, on the Twenty-first Day of January 2020 subsequent, and in relation to the Third reading of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill,* seized from the votes.parliament.uk website.

- **46. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/05 clearly evidences the Division Date recorded as the Twenty-first Day of January 2020, and the subject matter of the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Bill.*
- **47. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/05 clearly evidences the participation of Five Hundred and Twenty-four (including tellers), named and therefore identifiable Members of Parliament, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, in a Division on what would become, the *European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020.*
- **48. I say that,** EXHIBIT OCC/MCC/05 clearly evidences, Five Hundred and Twenty-four, named and therefore identifiable Members of Parliament, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland breaching their oath, or affirmation of allegiance.
- **49. I say that,** under English law the following One Thousand, One Hundred and Forty-eight men, and woman, who swore personal oaths, or made affirmations of allegiance to our late, and beloved Queen Elizabeth II subsequent to the General Election on the Twelfth Day of December 2019, that they are evidenced breaching, by

participating in at least one of the following Divisions that occurred in the House of Commons on the Twentieth Day of December 2019, the Ninth Day of January 2020, or in the House of Lords on the Twenty-first Day of January 2020, that led to Parliament declaring itself Sovereign, in the E.U. (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020. GENERAL AND FINAL PROVISION

Parliamentary sovereignty

38 Parliamentary sovereignty

(1) It is recognised that the Parliament of the United Kingdom is sovereign.

- (2) In particular, its sovereignty subsists notwithstanding-
 - (a) directly applicable or directly effective EU law continuing to be recognised and available in domestic law by virtue of section 1A or 1B of the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 (savings of existing law for the implementation period),
 - (b) section 7A of that Act (other directly applicable or directly effective aspects of the withdrawal agreement),
 - (c) section 7B of that Act (deemed direct applicability or direct effect in relation to the EEA EFTA separation agreement and the Swiss citizens' rights agreement), and
 - (d) section 7C of that Act (interpretation of law relating to the withdrawal agreement (other than the implementation period), the EEA EFTA separation agreement and the Swiss citizens' rights agreement).

.....

(3) Accordingly, nothing in this Act derogates from the sovereignty of the Parliament of the United Kingdom.
